

## Minute 2

### I - Introduction

On the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January two thousand and twenty-four, at 10 hours the jury nominated by the CCMAR board of Directors on 06/12/2023, met by video conference, for the second meeting of the call Ref. CCMAR/BINGAM/25/2023. The meeting was held for the selection of a Research Fellowship (BI) for a holder of a Master's degree (Bolsa de Investigação não conducente à obtenção de grau académico para mestre), for the project, *HealthyBi4Namibe - Development of technological tools to improve and reduce health risks for bivalve consumption in Angola*, funded by the Aga Khan, Network for Development and the Portuguese Foundation for Science and Technology, I.P./MCTES. The composition of the nominated jury was Doctor João Cardoso, researcher at CCMAR and coordinator of the project (President); Professor Deborah Power, Full Professor at Algarve University and group leader (member) and Doctor Rute Castelo Félix, researcher at UALG and CCMAR (member), and the meeting had the following agenda: admission and evaluation of the applications admitted for the fellowship CCMAR/BINGAM/25/2023.

### III - Exclusion of applications

#### IV - Evaluation of applications

The Jury evaluated the application documents of the eligible candidates (**Table 2**) and applied the classification criteria and weighting factors set out in the vacancy announcement as shown in **Table 3** below:

Evaluation criteria and respective weighting:

1. Master academic degree grade - 35%;
2. Proven experience in molecular biology techniques for nucleic acid analysis extraction and amplification – 15%;
3. Proven experience in microbiology and biochemical methods for marine pathogenic bacteria - 20%;
4. Previous work experience in research in the area of molecular microbiology- 25%;
5. Published scientific articles or scientific presentations in the field of knowledge - 5%;

Note: The final grades in **Table 3** represent the average of the individual evaluation performed by each member of the jury, presented on a scale from **0** to **20**, rounded to the nearest tenth.

**Table 4** presents the final classification.

With no other item on the agenda, the meeting of which these minutes were drawn up was closed, with 3 pages, and annex, which after being read and approved were signed by the members of the jury.
